Mother is willing that I should go up there. she says that

she had rather that I would go up there the fall then next springe for if I wait untill next spring I may not get any work there then, and it will cost me more then then it will now, so all that Sam waiting for now is the Box, and if it don't get here in two weeks. I intend to go aft after it. and that will cost me more then it would to have it sent by express There was quite an exect ment here the red of the month. there was a horse thief brought here in the morning, he had not bon here long before there were a great to many men here farm others counties, and at one o clock they took him to the world woods and hung him in the presame of about to three or four hundy men, he was the ring leador of a band of horse theer. he has broken gail three times and had as escapt from the Senitentiary once. Whare all well at present and I hope that you are the same, the weather is very cold here at A presant vit looks as though it was I am very discontented here for I am am not earning any thing here but if I had my clother I could go to work any time up at hudson Reeping ban of I had my clothe, but I can't go wort untill I get them and, mother don't like to have me tend & Bar, my love to you one and all Charles of Wilson Bo my dear own at home bharley left some aroun for me to write, so I thought I would write a few lines I am sorry that we have not had any news of the boy as yet, Charley is getting very meany about it, and not without a cause, I do hope that it will very soon get here, Charley talks of going to Joson as soon as he gets his daths, he is not satisfied with this part of the world, and on the whole, as he can get work there I think it would be the bost for him, although I would have been glad to til he could got into busines

here in town if Charles had been alife he could got him a situation on the cars, but as persondence has ordered of other roise, we must submit, I suppose you are all auxious to hear how of am situated, I are thankful to say, that as far as I know, that we are much better of then I might be, I have a good comfortabl home, and if all is paid in to the estate that is out, and no fals charges ar account brought. against the estate, there will be nearly a thousand dollars to come to us, there are over one Thousand dollars to ap in good notes to collect, and about three hundred dollars on the book, but I am afraid that some if not a good deal of that on the book will be lost if that part cauld and be callected, their would alwort, if not quite everugh to pay all the estate is awing, Charlo did not make a will, there is an administrator to settle the things, Charles requisted him to administer on the estate befor he died, I shall stay here, as I would not know where to go too to better moself, I have exellent neighbors , Charley can testify to that tell getertinde that I thank her for the present she send me, and I thank you all for the picture tharley brought, forephines of knew as room as I saw it, she has the same sweet inocent expresion she had when a chiles Mary I did not know at first, her face has lost its round neps Andrew looks better then he used to, Gertrude is a very weat looking person, I told Charly as soon as almost kill her, to live in this dirty part of the world your affectionally
